Of the 15 portraits that were identified at the time of acquisition, all were either faculty at Hillsdale College or graduates in 1862 and 1863. Twenty-two of the portraits were taken by Andrew & Ives, a photographic studio that operated in Hillsdale, Michigan from 1862 to 1863. All portraits are in the format of a carte-de-visité - the photograph being roughly 2.125 x 3.5 inches mounted on a card 2.5 x 4 inches. Alpha Kappa Phi Society Papers	1857 -	2 boxes	The Alpha Kappa Phi Society was a literary society at Hillsdale College. The Society evolved from an earlier organization named the Ciceronians. The Civil War monument on the Hillsdale College campus was erected as a memorial to the Alpha Kappa Phi members who served during the Civil War. Amphictyon Society Papers	1859 - 1915	1 box	The Amphictyon Society was a student literary society at Hillsdale College, founded in 1857, after breaking off from several other debating societies at the school. The gentleman's society conducted oral exercises and contests and fundraised through subscriptions to build a hall for their activities. Several members served in the Union Army during the Civil War. It appears that a moratorium on co-ed meetings by the college caused many members to leave the school in the spring of 1866, but the rule was eventually amended and many students returned. Information for this Society was gathered from a booklet published by the Amphictyons in 1869, twelve years after the society's founding. Below the multiplication table on the front wrap is a cartouche in which is written "This is the property of Thomas Richard December 1st 1848." Interior pages - 32 unnumbered, blue-ruled - have been filled with arithmetic problems, numbered. Thomas Richard has signed and dated most of the pages. The dates run from December 1, 1848, to January 30, 1849. The fact that each problem is numbered and the sequences start over on each new date leads us to believe that this might have been a student's workbook with that day's homework entered. However, none of the entries appear to have been graded. While we don't know where Thomas Richard was living at the time he wrote out the problems, as the weights, measures, currency, etc., all use American terms, we feel safe in assuming this workbook was created in America.</p> <p>A handwritten arithmetic cyphering book with some additional literary work is included. Bound in marbled boards, the copybook contains 100+ pages primarily of arithmetic problems. The student, Michael D. Reymer, noted that he was using Charles Davies's <i>Elementary Algebra</i> as his textbook. Reymer begins with algebraic equations of the first degree, then an 'Of Powers' section, radicals of the second degree, square root extraction, and promiscuous math questions and problems. Reymer's "Address Delivered to the Websterian Literary Society of Greencastle Academy" is included at the rear of the copybook's rear. Reymer was the president of said society, but was resigning from office (2 1/2 pages). Following this are several 1-page and 1/2-page essays: 'Perseverance,' 'Demosthenes to the Athenians,' 'Osmond's Dream,' 'Washington,' 'Gentleman's Fortune'. Reymer also used the copy books to practice his penmanship. Baldwin, Frank - Papers	1872 - 1923	1 box	Frank Dwight Baldwin was born in 1842 at Manchester, Michigan and died in 1923 at Denver, Colorado. Raised in Michigan, Baldwin served during the Civil War in the 19th Michigan Infantry. He was awarded the Medal of Honor for actions at the Battle of Peachtree during the Atlanta Campaign. Following his discharge, Frank Baldwin entered Hillsdale College where he remained a student until he was offered a commission in 1866 as a 2nd Lieutenant in the 19th U.S. Regular Infantry. He made the army his career and retired as a Major General. He was stationed out west during the Indian Wars and was the first man to be awarded a Medal of Honor in two different conflicts. His second Medal of Honor was awarded for the rescue of kidnapped girls in 1874. He married Alice Blackwood in 1867 and they had one daughter, Juanita. Major General Frank D. Blackman, Edgar A. – Civil War Correspondence	1862 - 1864	24 items	The Edgar A. Blackman Civil War Correspondence spans Blackman's Civil War service from 1862-1864. The letters are from members of Blackman's family to Blackman during his military service. There are 13 letters, 10 envelopes, and 1 Certificate of Discharge. Edgar A. Blackman was born in Van Buren, MI, in 1845. He served with Company C. 140th Regiment of Indiana Infantry Volunteers, 3rd Brig., 3rd Div., 23rd Army Corps from October 7th, 1864, to July 11th, 1865, when he was honorably discharged. He married Louise Marrilla Cole on April 15th, 1868, and they had three children, one of whom died in infancy. From at least 1886 until his death in 1892, Blackman served as the Editor of the Hillsdale Democrat in Hillsdale, MI. His son Hiram C. Blackman continued as Editor of the Hillsdale Democrat after his father's death. His daughter, Daisy Blackman, married Edgar O. Galloway in 1901. Her son, James Galloway, is the namesake of the Galloway dorm on the campus of Hillsdale College. He married his wife Sylvia Temperance Bishop in 1845 and served in the military at least between 1846 and 1861. They had two children who survived infancy – Charles (1847-1868) and Eleanor (1861-1937). Mr. Carus donated his collection to Hillsdale College for educational purposes to be used both in the classroom and other venues. It reflects his interest in the historical, economic, and educational importance of money. The collection itself contains a broad range of coins and currency, including coins from ancient Greece, Macedon, and Rome, as well as Byzantine, Islamic, Chinese, and Medieval English coins and currency. Mr. Carus also collected coins from the United States and foreign countries, including Australia, Brazil, Canada, France, Germany, Great Britain, India, Mexico, Russia, and many others. This amendment was the third and last of the Reconstruction Amendments. The election of Ulysses S.
